This business report is intended to provide a comprehensive, up to date overview of the workings of TextRelease and the International Grey Literature Network Service. TextRelease is an independent program and conference bureau specializing in the field of grey literature and networked information.

GreyNet, Grey Literature Network Service, was founded in 1992 and re-launched in 2003 under the leadership and direction of TextRelease. Since its relaunch, it has developed into an international network capable of serving various sectors of government, academics, business and industry as well as subject based communities producing, processing, and distributing grey literature. GreyNet's mission is dedicated to research, publication, open access, and education in the field of grey literature; and this requires now more than ever an infrastructure commensurate to its real potential.

In order to further expand and develop future capabilities for the Grey Literature Network Service, an infrastructure other than that of a sole proprietorship is essential. While TextRelease provided a basis for GreyNet's relaunch, it alone cannot render the needed capital and investment for GreyNet's potential to develop and expand on the global information landscape. The ideal organization would be focused internationally and have genuine interest in the field of grey literature both in digital and print formats.

GreyNet might do well to model upon an infrastructure of that of an international association or to merge with a major partner seeking to enhance its position on the information landscape. In either case, TextRelease will strive to cooperate with leading organizations in the further development of GreyNet International. To this end, GreyNet has expanded its current infrastructure to include three new committees alongside the conference program committee. More on this and other developments are found in this Mid-Year Business Report.

As Program and Conference Bureau, the main activities of TextRelease include the identification and negotiation with potential conference hosts for the annual conference venues and the identification and acquisition of conference sponsors and advertisers. The formation of Program Committees and Chairpersons along with the initial draft of conference themes incorporated in the announcements and call-for-papers. TextRelease maintains contact with authors throughout the lead-up to the conference providing them with guidelines for their content submissions and informing them of their status on the conference program. TextRelease further processes the conference registrations, organizes a suited social program, facilitates hotel accommodations, and coordinates and implements a host of web based and other promotional activities in order to raise conference participation. TextRelease is further responsible for the design, compilation, editing, and publication of conference materials and documents issuing from the Conference Series. Foremost among these are the conference site, newsletters, program books, and conference proceedings.

International Conference Series on Grey Literature, 1993-1999

The GL Conference Series began as a biannual event in the early '90s, however with its relaunch in 2003, the conference series became an annual event. The GL Conference Series maintains a transatlantic character alternating between Europe and North America. However, participants from recognized organizations worldwide actively sponsor and participate.

GreyNet's Open Access Resources



Over 300 metadata records originating in the GL Conference Series including their corresponding full-text papers, PowerPoint slides, abstracts, biographical notes, and post-publication commentaries are available via the OpenGrey Repository <http://www.opengrey.eu>. This web-based resource has become a significant reference tool for GreyNet's own referral service. Since its relaunch in 2003, GreyNet maintains solely Non-Exclusive Rights Agreements with its author base. In 2005, GreyNet organized together with INIST-CNRS the 7th International Conference on Grey Literature titled "Open Access to Grey Resources" and in the spring of 2006 issued a clarification on the 'Grey Road to Open Access' in which an alternative to the green and gold roads was suggested. In 2007, GreyNet (data provider) signed an agreement with INIST (service provider) in which all of its past and future collections of conference preprints would be openly accessible in the OpenGrey Repository (formerly OpenSIGLE). In 2009, GreyNet purchased back the rights to content from its first four conference proceedings (1994-2000), making these also openly accessible and thus guaranteeing that its collections would be comprehensive. Since its relaunch, GreyNet has also sought to engage open dialogue and exchange with commercial publishers related to both publishing and research. Content originating within GreyNet's author base has been further published via journals, a licensed database, as well as in monograph form.



Agreement has been reached between OpenGrey and OpenAIRE, whereby GreyNet's Collection of Conference Preprints in the OpenGrey Repository will soon be harvested and accessible in OpenAIRE via its Discovery services.



GreyNet has completed the second phase of an Enhanced Publications Project (EPP) in which research data accompanying conference preprints are entered in the DANS Data Archive and cross-linked to records in the OpenGrey Repository. Guide to Good Practices and Resources in Grey Literature

The Guide to Good Practice in Grey Literature offers information professionals, practitioners and students common ground for good practice in grey literature. The GreyGuide is an online forum and repository of good practice in the field of grey literature. The GreyGuide seeks to capture proposed as well as published practices dealing with the supply and demand sides of grey literature. This is a collaborative project involving GreyNet International and ISTI-CNR Pisa, Italy.

GreyGuide Repository and Web Access Portal

In early 2014, GreyNet reached agreement with the National Research Center in Pisa, the service provider for the GreyGuide Repository. GreyNet collections and content that are as yet only accessible either via its website or allied conference site will now migrate to the GreyGuide Repository. In this way, the GreyGuide will function as GreyNet's web access portal. This will allow for combined search, browse, and retrieval capability - where standardized metadata and full-text can be online harvested. Soon, alongside good practices in the GreyGuide, GreyNet's in-house collections on persons and organizations in the field of grey literature, as well as projects and conference proposals will become accessible via the GreyGuide in 2014:

The Pisa Declaration on Policy Development for Grey Literature Resources

In April of this year, information professionals from Europe's finest academic and research centers met in Pisa to address issues dealing with the policy and management of grey literature resources. This meeting resulted in the formulation of the Pisa Declaration for Grey Literature – a 15 point roadmap, which serves as a guide for organizations involved in the production, publication, access and use of grey literature well into this 21st Century. The Pisa Declaration much like the Budapest, Bethesda, and Berlin Declarations are neither inventions of the mind nor improvements in doing the same things better – instead, they offer a different approach in dealing with information and data to meet the market needs and requirements of today.

Until now, the problem was the lack of cooperation and coordination between and among organizations dealing with grey literature. However, the time of going it alone is now ended. The Pisa Declaration marks the close of an era of *ad hoc* policy and decision making with regard to grey literature resources. GreyNet's own commitment to the Pisa Declaration is led by the Research Policy Committee recently established to further coordinate GreyNet's collections in the OpenGrey Repository, the DANS Data Archive, and the recently launched GreyGuide Repository. You too can provide a significant contribution to this initiative by endorsing the Pisa Declaration, which will be ratified at the Library of Congress this December during a special session of the Sixteenth International Conference on Grey Literature. <http://greyguide.isti.cnr.it/pisadecla/iscrivi.php>

Educational and Training Initiatives in Grey Literature



Course modules and training are available not only to instructors and students at Schools and Colleges of Library and Information Science, but also to professionals and practitioners working to serve their knowledge based communities. 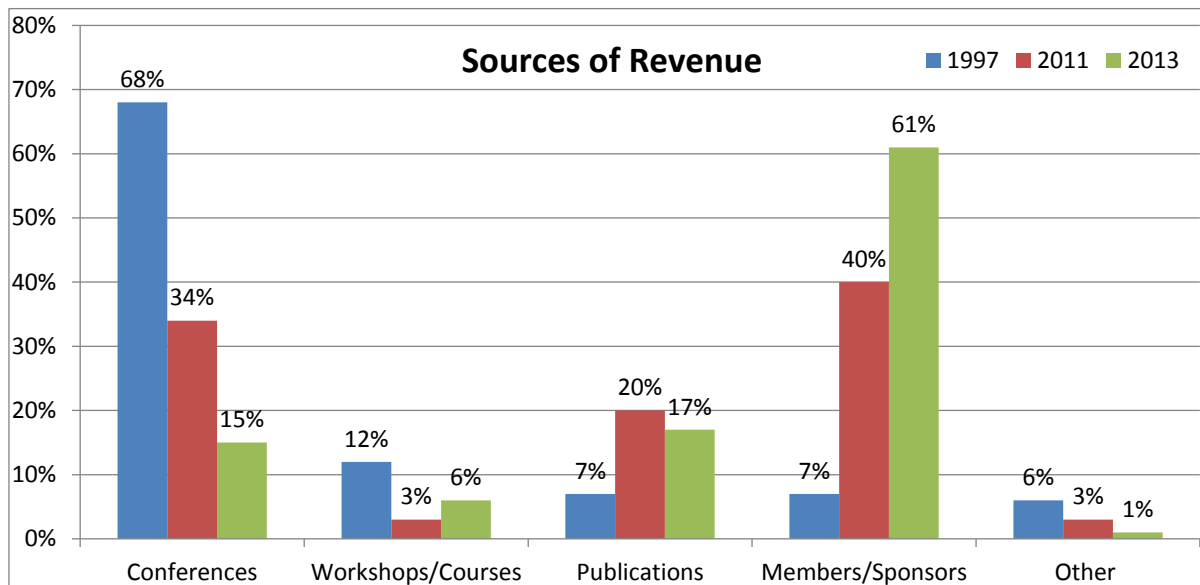

Financial Indicators

Since 2003, TextRelease via GreyNet has increased and diversified its sources of revenue. Where it initially was dependent almost solely on participant fees to the international conference series, TextRelease has since increased revenues issuing from membership fees, sponsorship fees, advertising, the sale of publications, journal licensing, royalties, as well as educational and training initiatives. In 2012, membership and sponsorship fees represented over 45% of the revenues, conference fees just over 30%, and publication fees just short of 20%. Together, these three sources of revenue account for nearly 95% of the gross income.

GreyNet’s Main Sources of Revenue



As seen in the chart above, revenues issuing directly from conference fees have considerably decreased over the years, while the number of conference participants has not. This can be accounted for by the fact that GreyNet has acquired more organizational members as well as conference sponsors. And, their paid membership and sponsorship fees entitles them to participation in the conferences. Another factor that explains the decrease in conference revenues are the reductions now offered to authors, students, and employees of host organizations.

These figures are based on direct revenues, while other indirect revenues also have to be taken into consideration. For example, a conference host that provides the location, equipment, and catering for the annual event circumvents costs to the Program and Conference Bureau. A sponsor for a social event linked to a conference is yet another example of indirect or non-accounted revenues without which TextRelease would be unable to meet its operating costs.

Operating Costs

Direct and indirect costs associated with TextRelease and its Grey Literature Network Service include human resources, office maintenance, travel and lodging (related to site visits, conferences, workshops, committee meetings and other field work), conference materials and publications, as well as special events (annual award dinner, social programs, reception, conference tours, etc.).

Better access to funding and grants. Streamlining the workflow through outsourcing. Further cooperation with the Open Access Community as well as further cooperation with Commercial Publishers. More use of available social media and networks.

Threats

Continuity, inability to respond to growth leading to missed opportunities, infrastructure's command of the ever changing information landscape, the current financial climate.
