Clarification on the 'Grey Road to Open Access'

The Grey Literature Network Service (GreyNet) has been working since 1993 to make grey literature more visible and accessible to all sectors of information society. Last year, GreyNet actively participated in the Seventh International Conference on Grey Literature titled 'Open Access to Grey Resources'. After the results from this conference were viewed alongside the two options of the golden or green road to open access, GreyNet found it difficult to fully identify with one of the two current options. While the 'green road' is a close description, GreyNet 'de facto' does much more for the authors and researchers, whom it serves. GreyNet, a networked service provided by TextRelease (a) makes its author base aware of available options, (b) does not exclude authors from choosing other options, and (c) actively seeks on their behalf other options by which their research results are further published, archived, and promoted.
